



IMPOSITION OF UNLOCK 3 IN DISTRICT GURDASPUR

Whereas Lockdown Unlock-2/ revised 1 under section 144 of Cr.Pc was imposed by undersigned to prevent and contain spread of corona virus COVID-19 disease vide order no 10251-10301/ MA/ Dated 13.06.2020.

Whereas Secretary, Home Affairs and Justice, Government of Punjab has issued guidelines vide letter No.SS/ACSH/2020/560 Dated: Chandigarh, the 31ST of July, 2020 in to prevent/contain COVID-19 infection.

Whereas now keeping in view the guidelines issued by Secretary Home, Government of Punjab by aforesaid letter, I Mohammad Ishfaq, IAS, hereby issues the following orders in territorial jurisdiction of District Gurdaspur under section 144 of Cr.PC. and the orders issued vide no. are 10251-10301/ MA/ Dated 13.06.2020 hereby revoked.

The guidelines applicable in the District outside the containment zone till further orders as follows:-

1. Activities prohibited in areas outside Containment zones.

The following activities shall not be permitted:-

1. Schools, colleges, educational and coaching institutions will remain closed till 31st August, 2020. On-line/distance learning shall continue to be permitted and shall be encouraged.
2. International air travel of passengers, except as permitted by MHA.
3. Cinema halls, swimming pools, entertainment parks, theatres, bars, auditoriums, assembly halls and similar places.

Yoga institutes and gymnasiums will be allowed to function from 5th of August 2020 for which, Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) will be issued by the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (MoHFW), Government of India (GoI).

4. Social/political/sports/entertainment/academic/cultural/religious functions and other large congregations.

2. Lockdown

Lockdown shall continue in the areas declared as containment zone; however essential services are permitted in these areas.

3. Guidelines for areas outside containment zones.

The guidelines as under, would be applicable to the areas outside the containment zones

1) Night Curfew (11.00 PM to 05.00 AM)

Movement of individuals for all the non-essential activities shall remain prohibited between 11.00 pm to 5.00 am throughout the District.

However, essential activities including operation of multiple shifts, movement of persons and goods on National and State Highways and unloading of cargo and travel of persons to their destinations after disembarking from buses, trains and aeroplanes will be permitted.

2) National Directives

The National Directives for Covid-19 Management shall be strictly followed throughout the District (attached)

3) Movement of persons with SOPs

Movement by passenger trains and Shramik special trains, domestic air travel, movement of Indian Nationals stranded outside the country and of specified persons to travel abroad, evacuation of foreign nationals and sign-on and sign-off of Indian seafarers will continue to be regulated as per SOPs issued.

4) Protection of vulnerable persons

The persons above 65 years of age, persons with co-morbidity, pregnant women and children below the age of 10 years are advised to stay at home except for essential requirements and for health purposes.



5) Annual examinations, competitive examinations, Admission/ entrance tests conducted by Universities, Boards, Public Service Commissions and other institutions:

The Union Secretary has, vide DO letter dated 20.05.2020 has permitted Board and other examinations.

Accordingly, all kinds of examinations, admission /entrance tests conducted by Universities, Boards, Public Service Commissions and other institutions are allowed with usual precautions or sanitation and social-distancing.

6) School, Colleges, Educational and Coaching Institutions are allowed to open for office work, Online teaching and book distribution only.

7) Restricted activities

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| (i) Marriage related gatherings | Number of guests not to exceed thirty (30). |
| (ii) Funeral/last rites | Number of persons not 10 exceed twenty(20). |
| (iii) Spitting in public places | is completely prohibited and punishable with fine. |
| (iv) Consumption of liquor, pan, gutka, tobacco etc. in public places | is prohibited. |
- However, there will be no restriction on their sale

8) Religious places/places of worship for public:

- Places of worship/religious places shall remain open only between 5 am to 8 pm.
- The maximum number of persons at the time of worship shall not exceed 20 with due distancing and therefore, the worship time should be staggered accordingly.
- The managements of these places shall make adequate arrangements to ensure hand hygiene, social distancing and wearing of masks.
- Langar and Prasad are allowed.
- SOP for religious places be followed (Attached)

9) Restaurants

- Restaurants are allowed to open till 10 pm with 50% occupancy or 50 guests, whichever is less. Liquor can be served provided the restaurant has a valid permission from the Excise Department.
- The bars shall remain closed.
- The management will comply with the SoP attached herewith.

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10) Hotels and other Hospitality Units:

- a. Restaurants in Hotels are allowed to serve food including buffet meals upto 50% of their seating capacity or 50 guests, whichever is less. These restaurants would also be open to persons other than hotel guests but the timings for both the hotel guests as well as persons from outside would be till 10 pm.
- b. The bars shall remain closed. However, liquor can be served in the Rooms and restaurants, as permitted under the Excise policy of the State.
- c. SoP attached herewith shall be followed.

11) Marriages, other Social Functions and 'Open-Air' parties:

- a. Marriages, other Social Functions and 'Open-Air' Parties in Banquet Halls, Marriage Palaces, Hotels and open venues can be organised up to thirty (30) persons. The number of guests exclusive of catering staff would not exceed thirty (30) persons.
- b. The size of Banquet Hall and venue for thirty (30) persons shall at least be 3,000 sq. feet based on requirement of 10' x10' area for a person for the purpose of maintenance of adequate social distancing.
- c. The Bars shall, continue to remain closed. However liquor can be served in the function as per the Excise Policy of the State.
- d. SOP for hotels and other hospitality units will be followed.

12) Opening of Shops and shopping Malls:

- a. All the Shopping Malls and shops including shops in main bazaars in both urban and rural areas allowed to open between 7.00 am to 8.00 pm.
- b. However restaurants/ hotels situated within shopping malls are to be treated separately and can remain open upto 10 pm
- c. Liquor vends shall remain open from 8 am to 10 pm.
- d. Barber shops, hair-cut saloons, beauty parlours and Spas will be allowed from 7 am to 8 pm subject to compliance of the SOP as issued by the Health Department, Punjab.

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Week- end restrictions (Sundays)

- a. Shops: shops dealing with Milk supply, Fruits and vegetables, Bakeries, Chemists, medical establishments and sweet shops shall be allowed to remain open till 8 pm on all days.
- b. Restaurants and Liquor Vends: will continue to remain open till 10 pm on all days.
- c. On Sundays, shops (other than those mentioned in "a" above and in shopping malls shall remain closed.

However on Sunday, 02/08/2020 all shops & shopping malls will remain open from 7am to 8 pm on account of Raksha Bandhan

13) Sports complexes, stadia and public parks: shall be allowed to open between 05.00 am to 8.00 pm without spectators as per the SOP of the Health Department.

14) Industries & industrial establishments, Construction Activities etc are allowed

15) Movement of Buses and Vehicles:

Inter-state and intra-state movement of buses would be allowed without any restriction.

Transport vehicles can utilise the entire seating capacity.

16) Permits and passes:

- a. No separate permission would be required by the industries and other establishments for their operations. All employees would be allowed without any requirement of pass during the permitted hours as mentioned in the above paragraphs for various establishments.
- b. There shall be no restriction on inter-state and intra-state movement of persons and goods and no separate permission/approval/permit will be required for such movement.
- c. Use of Cova-app and self-generated pass would be mandatory for inter-state passengers

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17) Social distancing and wearing of Masks

- a. Social distancing i.e. minimum 6 feet distance (do gaz ki duri) for all the activities shall always be maintained. Accordingly, if any permitted activity leads to crowding and congestion, then necessary steps in terms of staggering, rotation, timings of offices and establishments etc. be taken and it be ensured that principles of social distancing are not compromised.
- b. Wearing of masks by all persons in public places including work places etc. will be mandatory and must be strictly observed and enforced.

18) Use of Arogaya Setu :

Employees are advised to ensure that Arogaya Setu is installed by all the employees having compatible mobile phones. Similarly, individuals are also advised to install Arogaya Setu application on their compatible mobile phones and also regularly update their health status on the app.

- 19) Social visits:** By and large, there is no restriction on movement by persons within city or districts. However, such a movement shall be essential risks and social visits, with no essential task shall be avoided and restricted and it shall be as per the SOP being issued by the Department of Health, Government of Punjab .

- 20) Inter-State movement of goods traffic** is allowed without any restriction.

21) Construction activities


- a. **Construction activities:** are allowed without any restriction in both the Urban and rural areas.
- b. No restriction on trucks/ vehicles carrying building materials.

- 22) Agricultural, horticultural, animal husbandry, veterinary services:** are allowed without any restriction.

- 23) Banks and Finance institutions** are permitted to open according to their timings

- 24) Courier and Postal services** are permitted according to their timings.

- 25) E — Commerce:** are permitted for all goods



26) Offices

- i. Central Government and Private Offices: allowed to open as per required strength without any restrictions except that compliance of social distancing and wearing of masks at all times, shall be ensured. If so required, the timings may be adjusted to work in small teams to ensure strict compliance of these restrictions.
- ii. Punjab Government Offices: All the Punjab government offices would remain open with full strength. However, the head of the Office will ensure that there is adequate space for maintaining social-distancing norms.

27) Movement of Buses and Vehicles

- a. *Movement of inter-state buses*: will be allowed with full capacity , as per the directions of the Transport Department, Government of Punjab,
- b. *Movement of intra-state buses* : will be allowed with full capacity , as per the directions of the Transport Department, Government of Punjab.
- c. *Movement of taxis and Cab aggregators* : will be allowed with full capacity , as per the directions of the Transport Department, Government of Punjab.
- d. *Bicycles, rickshaws and auto- rickshaws*: will be allowed with full capacity as per the directions of the Transport Department, Government of Punjab.
- e. *4-wheelers*: will be allowed with full capacity, as per the directions of the Transport Department, Government of Punjab. No pass would be required for permitted activities like shopping, going to the office and workplace.
- f. *2-wheelers*: will be allowed subject to compliance of the SOP as issued by the Transport Department, Punjab for 1+1 passengers.
- g. *There will be no restriction on movement of goods*

28) Penal provisions:

Any violation of these guidelines and lockdown measures shall be punishable under sections 51 to 60 of the Disaster management Act, 2005 besides legal action under section 188 of Indian Penal Code (IPC).

These order shall come into force from 01.08.2020
